

WELCOME TO LEVEL A1.1 OF SPANISH AT BCNLIP

This course is designed to help you get started from scratch on your journey to learning Spanish. Here, we explain in a simple way how the classes are organized, what you'll learn, and how we'll assess your progress.

What are you going to learn?

At this level you will learn to:

- Introduce yourself, say hello and say goodbye.
- Talk about yourself: your name, age, nationality and profession.
- Say why you want to learn Spanish and what you can do.
- Talk about places, cities and weather.
- Express tastes, preferences and needs.

How are you going to learn?

With hands-on activities, games, group work, and real-life tasks that will help you communicate from the start.

Duration and organization of the course

Good of the types of courses A1.1:

Intensive courses (20 hours per week)

- **30 hours of main class:** 2 hours a day, Monday to Thursday, with the manual *Plus Class 1* (units 1-4).
- **Mandatory workshops:** **Grammar** (Monday and Wednesday) – 3h/week
Conversation (Tuesdays and Thursdays) – 3h/week
- **Cultural immersion** (Friday) – 2h/week
- **Phonetics, spelling and listening comprehension** (Friday) – 4h/week

Extensive course (fewer hours per week)

- **30 hours of core classes to complete level A1.1:** 4 hours per week, spread over 2 days a week.

- It also includes access to workshops depending on availability and level.

What materials do we use?

We work with the book **Aula Plus 1** (Difusión publishing house), as well as many digital resources and interactive activities. You can also access additional materials on the virtual campus.

Class content (regular class, 2 hours each day) per week

- **Week 1: Us**

Learn to introduce yourself, talk about your age, profession, and nationality.

- **Week 2: I want to learn Spanish**

Express your motivations, skills and interests.

- **Week 3: Where is Santiago?**

Learn to describe places, locate things, talk about the weather.

- **Week 4: Your friends are my friends**

Talk about your friends, interests, and plan a weekend with colleagues.

Grammar and conversation workshops will review the content covered in class.

How is the course evaluated?

The evaluation is continuous and takes into account:

- Your attendance (minimum 80%)
- Your active participation in class
- Your attitude and personal work

He final exam The course has different parts:

- Oral part
- Written part
- Reading comprehension

- Listening comprehension
- Grammar test

The exam is digital, except for the written and oral parts. It is done the last week of the course.

Personalized tutoring

After the exam, you will have **an individual tutoring** with your teacher to discuss your progress, resolve doubts, and plan your next steps in learning.

Credit system

In intensive courses, they are used **academic credits**. To complete level A1, you need to earn 20 credits (full level, A1.1 + A1.2).

They give them to you for:

- Core classes: 8 credits
- Grammar and conversation workshops: 6 credits
- Immersion classes: 3 credits
- Friday workshops (phonetics, spelling and audio): 3 credits
- To pass, you must complete at least 80% of the credits.

And also... you will learn culture

In each unit, you'll also learn important things about the customs, speech patterns, and ways of life in different Spanish-speaking countries. You'll learn to compare cultures and communicate with respect and curiosity.
